President's Message

What Camera is the Best camera???

Best answer is the one you have with you at the time you need to capture a particular moment in time.

We had a wonderful presentation from Peter Ferguson of the WCC at our November program meeting and Peter highlighted the strengths of DSLR vs. Point and Shoot. It was very evident that the small point and shoots with large optical zoom lenses handle macro photography and easily tracked subjects. DSLR's shine for wildlife and subjects that require fast focus and tracking.

I have recently moved to an iPhone4 and it has some neat camera features. There is a 5 megapixel camera with a 0.3 MP forward facing camera for Skype, Face - Time and self-portraits. The iPad2 and iPhone4S both have 8 megapixel cameras.

There is a multitude of apps available for the iPhone, Android and Blackberry devices. Since my iPhone is always in a pocket I have invested in a couple of Apps for the device. NIK Software the maker of the great photographic filter plugins for editing software has "SnapSeed", a suite of simple filters and tweaks for iPhone cameras. A few weeks back I was out for an early morning shoot and was waiting for the sun to light a part of the subject I was shooting and had some time to wait for the sun to do its thing. I took out my iPhone and snapped a shot went into "SnapSeed", cropped the image, adjusted colours and saturation, added a frame and posted on FaceBook groups in a minute or two! Talk about speed to publish!

I have also found a nifty camera App called "Camera+" that has a multitude of Scenes, Effects, Frames, and adjustments that will take a simple capture and make it remarkable. There is another App called "Photoforge" that adds layers and effects just like computer-based photo editing software! All done on a 3.5" screen or 10" if you have an iPad or other tablet.

Don't under estimate the power of the devices you have close at hand. I still love using my DSLR for the subjects I think I will need larger prints however a 5 megapixel camera can still produce reasonable 11X14 prints. The only caveat is you will need to zoom with your feet. There is little to no margin for cropping and forget the digital zoom. As with all digital cameras make sure you turn your digital zooms off. This is best handled with post processing after you capture the images.
