I am mostly interested in landscape photography, and sometimes I dabble with wildlife photos, if they present themselves to me. I am not a very patient person when it comes to waiting for animals to appear, and look at photos of wildlife as more of an added bonus to landscape photography.

In 2016, I "upgraded" my camera to the Nikon D600 - which is full frame.



I have experimented with doing portraits, weddings, and newborn photography in the last few years, but my passion stays with landscapes. It is easier to get a photograph when your subject matter doesn't move or cry, and can't look at the back of the camera and tell you they don't like their hair or face in that photo.

My passion for photography has allowed me to travel to places I never thought i'd get to. These places include Iceland, Malta, BC, Alberta and Ireland.

COVID has put a damper on any recent travel plans, so most trips this year were to Algonquin Park - which I am perfectly fine with. However, I look forward to being able to travel to new places in the future.
