About our Name Change

Since 1954 the Niagara Falls Camera Club has been meeting for interested persons to learn, enjoy, discuss and explore photography.

Over the years, the club has met in various locations until 1975 when it found a new home in the LaMarsh Room at the Niagara Falls Public Library, Victoria Avenue. In 2022 we moved again to our current meeting place at the Stamford Centre Volunteer Firemen's Association Hall at Fireman's Park.

The club was one of the founding clubs of the former Niagara Frontier Regional Camera Clubs which ended operations in June.

In 2023, the NFCC changed its name from The Niagara Falls Camera Club to the Niagara Association of Photographic Art (NAPA) and debuted an updated website to reflect the new name, NiagaraPhoto.org. As we've met different people throughout our travels, we've found there was a thought that a camera club was for a bunch of old people talking about their equipment and for potential new members, that idea seemed to be a deterrent to joining us. This change reflects the growing interest in photography as an art form and our focus on the image as opposed to the equipment used to create the image.

ENTRY NUMBERS: TWO DIGIT NUMBERS BETWEEN 01 AND 12

Month	September	October	November	December	January	February
Entry Number	01, 02	03, 04	05. 06	07, 08	09, 10	11, 12

The file naming format is:

Category_Level_Entry Number_Member's Name_Image Name

For example:

1. Mary Smith is a member entering her first competition. She titles her first entry as follows:

P_B_01_Mary Smith_Lighthouse at Dusk

2.John Henry is at the silver level and has a nature entry. It is his second entry in November (i.e. his 6th entry for the year) The file will be named as follows:

N_S_06_John Henry_Snoopy Raccoon
