

Judge's Pick from the September Competition

Reflection by Scott Simons



Scott explains:

This image is deceiving. What you think is the hard part was quite easy, and what you don't even think about was quite difficult.

It is obviously 2 images put together in Photoshop. The model's instructions were one shot eyes open and the next eyes closed. No change in expression. No eyebrow movement or smile, etc.

You open both in Photoshop. The main image is eyes closed, so you select her open eyes from the other image and move them into place. The easy part is done.

Onto the more difficult part, the edge of the mirror. In the original shot, it was very bright to almost white. This is typical for an unfinished edge of a mirror. Deciding to make it black on anything that went outside of her body was easy and done using spot healing and cloning tools.

The part that crossed her chest was way more difficult to select and downplay. I chose to make it as close to black as I could to make it stand out less. Lighting was simple with a softbox camera left.

St Jacobs Market District is a bustling, year-round marketplace with a country vibe featuring indoor/outdoor food and craft vendors and the Market Road Antiques.

What once began in 1975 as a place where farmers gathered to buy and sell their livestock, the St. Jacobs Farmers' Market has grown to host over 400 local producers, growers and artisans each year and is now a beloved community meeting place in the Region of Waterloo. In 50 short years, it has grown to become Canada's largest year-round outdoor farmers' market. This year marks the 50th year in operation.

Market Road Antiques is a 20,000 square foot indoor destination antique mall with over 100 antique dealer booths under one roof. Featuring quality furniture, glassware, tools, estate jewelry, collectibles, art, books, vintage clothing, toys and more.





Located just down the road from the historic Village of St. Jacobs, the area is known for its Mennonite heritage and authentic rural experience, where sightings of horse-drawn carriages, maple syrup farms and handmade quilts all act as reminders of a simpler, bygone era.

"Eileen Donan Castle is one of the most iconic castles in Scotland. It sits on an island where three lochs meet, surrounded by majestic scenery.

It was built in the mid-13th century, but different versions have been built and rebuilt throughout Scottish history. It was partially destroyed in a Jacobite uprising in 1719, and was left in ruins for almost 200 years. It was restored and reopened in 1932, and is now one of the most popular tourist destinations in the country.

I was lucky enough to visit the castle in 2024, on a typical overcast Scottish day. The heavy clouds seemed an appropriate backdrop to this looming stone structure."
